Treatment Representative Vacancy - Update

Jim reported that there have been no responses from the Facebook Ad posted. He also asked for any suggestions on marketing or the next step to take. None were given at the time. There will also be continued research concerning the requirement and timeliness to replace the treatment representative on the board.

State FY21 Application - Update

Jim reported that application is due February 3rd and were approved by the Commissioners earlier today. All of the In-Kind letters were received. Jim thanked all involved for their support and proofreading the application. All that is left is for the application to be signed by the Commissioners and then submitted to CST.

CJSB Grant Renewal Application - Update

Jim reported that the CJSB grant renewal application is in the process of being filled out. It is due February 10th but will need to be submitted for the February 4th Commissioner meeting by January 28th. He also reminded the board that this is our Biennial grant and the reward money will remain the same amount as rewarded for the last biennium.

Community Outreach

Jim reported that he presented to the Rotary club about JFDC last Thursday and it went very well. Sally Craig was present at the speech and stated that she felt it was good and heightened awareness since most people don't know about JFDC or come across juveniles involved in drug court. Jim is scheduled to present to the Lions club on Wednesday. During the commissioners meeting earlier he also reached out to Jonathan from the News Record and Jonathan called later this morning to follow up about possibly doing an article on JFDC. Char suggested that a response to the letter to the editor be written to let people know that Juvenile Drug Court exists as well.

Other Business

Coordinators Call – Jim reported that Alicia now has a supervisor. Financial audits are due by the end of the month and were approved by the commissioners today. He also reported that there was a reminder to make sure the data is in 5 Points, a representative from Natrona County asked if anyone would be interested in MRT (Moral Reconciliation Therapy) training, and that there is a new trend to achieve an opioid-like high by drinking 4 bottles of Imodium that can only be caught by blood tests.

Coalition of Alcohol and Tobacco – Jim reported that speakers from NA and AA came and presented at their monthly meeting. One of the speakers offered to come and meet the kids to try and help or present to them. Jim also said that Chad Beaman and himself spoke about a possible group or night where alumni from the ATC could meet and help the Juveniles in JFDC, or establish a possible mentorship between the two court alumni. Jamie Hurich suggested we keep in mind that AA is very

Christian based and keep that in mind before having a representative speak at a mandatory meeting. Bob Anderson mentioned that there was a non-denominational AA in town that could be sought out. Char also suggested looking into having representatives from all of the support groups come and present.

DFS Liaison Change – Bonnie Volk announced that Bob Anderson will be leaving DFS to work in Juvenile Probation. Taking his position on the JFDC team will be Fiona Conn.

PFI Education Classes – Phillip Sharp announced that PFI will not be canceling their education classes within 72 hours.

No further business was introduced. Meeting adjourned.
