



Campbell County SkyWarn Program Training Requirements



Purpose:

To collect severe weather reports for Campbell County EMA and the National Weather Service, Rapid City Weather Forecast Office.

Required Training:

- Attend one of NWS's annual severe summer weather training presentations in Wyoming or the Rapid City Forecast Area
 - Signature on Roster

Required:

- Signed application containing the statement that will not "Storm Chase," but instead will report from where they are (fixed location) in a place of safety in accordance with SkyWarn's ACES principles.

Upon completion of the above listed requirements, the SkyWarn member will be issued a Campbell County SkyWarn identification number and be placed on the "Spotter" notification list.
